Important Notes:

Please note that criminal history background checks are required for school district placements in conjunction with this required coursework and as required by Texas Administrative Code. Students should also be prepared to meet the requirements necessary to take the <u>Texas Educator Certification Exams</u> which includes bringing two pieces of original and valid identification. Students are responsible for a \$35 technology fee as required by Texas Education Association, TEA. The fee will be paid by the student via their account at UNT. Those students enrolled in ARTE 3753 who meet all admission requirements will be notified of acceptance to major and receive a completed degree audit/plan to facilitate their application to the College of Education.

It is strongly recommended that students initiate the College of Education application immediately after receiving notice of admittance.
