Important Note: Please note that you will have to undertake criminal history checks as required by school district placements in conjunction with our required coursework and as required by Texas Education Code.

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Pre-Art Education, Pre-ARTE, majors must meet the following criteria for admission to the Art Education, ARTE, program.

1. Complete at least 60 hours of college courses.
2. Completion with a grade of C or better of the following courses:
 - ART 1600: Foundations: Perception and Translation
 - ART 1700: Foundations: Space
 - ART 1800: Foundations: Narrative and Representation
 - ART 1900: Foundations: Systems and Transformations
 - ART 2350: Art History Survey I
 - ART 2360: Art History Survey II
 - ART 2370: Art History Survey III
 - ASTU 2101 or 2102: Beginning Ceramics
3. Complete two of the following with a grade of C or better:
 - ASTU 2201: Beginning Drawing and Painting: Painting I
 - ASTU 2300: Introduction to Printmaking
 - ASTU 2801 or 2802: Beginning Sculpture
 - ASTU 3202: Intermediate Drawing & Painting: Figure Drawing 1
4. Enroll in ARTE 3753 Art Education: Foundations
5. When students are enrolled in ARTE 3753 Art Education: Foundations or once this class is completed, they may apply for admission to the program. Admission is not guaranteed. Official degree plan must be filed for Art Education (ARTE) through completing the degree planning session in conjunction with a class meeting of ARTE 3753 Art Education: Foundations.

Art Education course requirements must be completed in the following sequence.

1. Semester 1: ARTE 4750: Art Education: Elementary Art Education Practices, ARTE 4760: Art Education: Global Aesthetics, and ARTE 4795: Topics in Art Education must be taken concurrently during the first semester.
2. Semester 2: ARTE 4780: Art Education: Secondary Art Education Practices must be taken concurrently with ARTE 4790: Art Education: Inquiry & Dialogue about Art during the second semester.

IMPORTANT: An additional requirement for the successful completion of the major entails admission into Teacher Education within the College of Education. Students must be admitted into Teacher Education **prior to being enrolled in ARTE 4780 Art Education: Secondary Art Education Practices.**

1. Review processed degree plan with CVAD advisor and generate a degree plan audit. You will need this for admission into Teacher Education within the [College of Education](#).
2. Complete the [Teacher Education Program Application](#) for the College of Education.
 - a. Admission requires junior status, a 2.75 grade point average (both UNT and overall), and grades of C or better on all art and education courses. There are very rare and limited possibilities for exceptions to this requirement.
 - b. Additional documents include your official Degree Audit from CVAD Academic Advising, proof of your TSI completion, and a completed/approved UNT Teacher Education Program Admissions Interview Questionnaire (completed/results in FolioTek).
 - c. Make an appointment with the Student Advising Office in the College of Education (940-565-2736, www.appointments.unt.edu).

3. Students are responsible for a \$35 technology fee as required by Texas Education Association, TEA. The fee will be paid by the student via their account at UNT.
